REPORTS OF OFFICERS, BOARDS AND COMMITTEES: Written reports received were Housing Authority minutes for May 8, 2000; Planning & Zoning minutes for May 16, 2000; Library Board minutes for April 27, 2000; Fire/Rescue minutes for April 11, 2000; Police Dept. Activity Report for May 2000.

<u>Cooper</u> informed all present of progress with the State Street Project. Laying the storm sewer is near completion. Will be pouring box for inlet and paving crew should be on sight at the beginning of next week. Proposal for sprinkler system issued by Northern Pump and proposal for landscape issued by Earl May. Cooper also noted that he has been in touch with Fred Schlegel and both parties are near an agreement for curb and gutter repair in front of his store (1st & "B").

<u>Burroughs</u> Welch Park ball field lights are up and completed. Pool operations, mechanically and employees, are running smoothly.

<u>Siebken</u> Activity Report for month of May was presented to Council. 750 total calls for service. New category has been added regarding calls directly related to S.C.C.

COMMUNICATIONS: Sales tax received for the month of March 2000 was \$12,743.88. April 2000 Franchise Tax Payment from Utili Corp. United received in the amount of \$14,627.67. Bruha mentioned the Forum that will

be held Thursday, June 8, 2000 by the Seward County Independent at Concordia College.

NEW BUSINESS:

Request to open alley – Scott Stutzman: The Council was approached by Scott & Kathy Stutzman regarding what channels need to be taken to completely open the alley located between 1st St. & Park Ave. and "C" & "D" Streets. Scott mentioned the concern for snow removal since the alley was not open all the way through. The maintenance dept. would have to back out after getting to the end of the current alley. There is no room to turn around with the road grader. There is one homeowner that is against dividing her lot at this time, which would open the alley completely. Bruha asked to wait for Attorney Blevens to arrive for legal opinion.

Change date of July meeting: The Council's consensus was to change the regular meeting date to July 10, 2000.

Employee Mileage: Currently the City is paying .24 per mile for employees who use their personal vehicles for City business. As of 7/1/99 the State of Nebraska has increased the mileage rate to .31 according to the Local Government Miscellaneous Expenditure Act. A motion was made by Bockoven and seconded by Cooper to increase the mileage rate for employees using personal vehicles to .31. Roll call vote: Bockoven yes, Cooper yes, Burroughs yes. Motion carried.

Galaxy Cable – New Services: Cameron Miller, State Manager for Galaxy Cablevision informed all present of updates in technology and what is to be available in the years to come. Digital Cable is offered through Galaxy with 49 basic channels. Doreen Hyde presented information on ISP Channel, Internet access over Galaxy Cable.

Attorney Blevens present, Council returned to **request to open alley**. Attorney Blevens noted the process of condemnation is very expensive and lengthy. No action could be taken by the Council so after further discussion Cooper offered to talk to Mildred Ferris and family regarding opening the alley.

Happy Birthday U.S.A. – Joyce Forst: Chamber of Commerce is planning a celebration on July 1, 2000. Joyce asked Council if they could close the streets surrounding the Uptown City Park for a parade and activities. The events are scheduled from 8:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. Bob Boshart commented that the Fire Dept. could find another way out of town with equipment if an emergency arose during such a short time frame. A motion was made by Cooper and seconded by Burroughs to allow the streets to be closed around the City Park during the parade. Roll call vote: Cooper yes, Burroughs yes, Bockoven yes. Motion carried.

Fireworks Permits: A motion was made by Cooper and seconded by Bockoven to approve the following Firework Permits submitted to the City of Milford: James Clarke, Jake's Fireworks Inc. – 921 W. 5th St., Milford Storm Baseball, Nebraska Fireworks – 5th & "F" St., Rich Ludvik, Ka-Boomers – 410 South State Hwy. Roll call vote: Cooper yes, Bockoven yes, Burroughs yes. Motion carried.

Proposal to vacate 3rd St. west of "F" St. – Dr. Katzberg with School Dist. #5 asked the City Council if they would be interested in opening 3rd St. west of "F" St. Proposals for additional parking spaces are currently under way and the school would be interested in allowing traffic to enter/exit at the above mentioned area. Concern for students crossing at 3rd and "F" and taking away the walkway was mentioned. Council would like to see parking area proposals when they are complete.

Authorization to pay Health Ins. immediately: Due to payment schedule of City bills and monthly schedule of J. Elaine Plessel's cobra coverage the pharmaceutical division of the health insurance was being cancelled for Elaine. City Clerk Jeanne Hoggins asked Council for permission to pay Health Insurance as soon as receiving it to correct this monthly cancellation. A motion was made by Burroughs and seconded by Bockoven to approve paying health insurance for the full time employees immediately. Roll call vote: Burroughs yes, Bockoven yes, Cooper yes. Motion carried.

Reappointment – Planning & Zoning: A motion was made by Bockoven and seconded by Burroughs to approve the Mayors recommendation to reappoint Howard Riedl to the Planning & Zoning Commission for a term of 3 years. Roll call vote: Bockoven yes, Burroughs yes, Cooper yes. Motion carried.

Request for variance – John DeMay: A request to place a storage shed north of the stairway at the 4-plex located at Park Ave. & "D" St. was presented to the Planning & Zoning on May 16, 2000. A recommendation was made to the Council to place the shed in front of the apartment complex at the west end of the building. There was a fire safety concern with storage of gas containers and flammable material so close to the apartment building. The concern of mobility of fire equipment was also another issue. A motion was made by Bockoven and died due to a lack of a second.

Addition to Comprehensive Plan – Egress window/setbacks: Item tabled to gather more information.

Hire Library Clerk: A motion was made by Bockoven and seconded by Cooper to hire Annie Henrichson as Library Clerk at a starting hourly rate of \$5.60. Roll call vote: Bockoven yes, Cooper yes, Burroughs yes. Motion carried.

Introduction and Adoption of Ordinance: Amend Handicap Parking – Councilmember Burroughs introduced the following Ordinance:

ORDINANCE NO. 704

AN ORDINANCE TO ESTABLISH OR RELOCATE HANDICAPPED PARKING STALLS, TO REPEAL ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH, AND TO PRESCRIBE THE TIME THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE IN FORCE AND TAKE EFFECT. (See Ordinance Record)

Approve Payment-Olsson Assoc. – **State Street Paving:** A motion was made by Cooper and seconded by Burroughs to approve payment of Invoice #42454 in the amount of \$6,509.00 to Olsson Assoc. Roll call vote: Cooper yes, Burroughs yes, Bockoven yes. Motion carried.

Concession Stand addendum: Due to a problem with sale of food outside the concession stand during a tournament an addendum was added to the original contract. A motion was made by Bockoven and seconded by Cooper to approve the addendum. Roll call vote: Bockoven yes, Cooper yes, Burroughs yes. Motion carried. A copy of the addendum is attached to these minutes.

Introduction and Adoption of Resolution: Sr. Center Corporate Account Form A motion was made by Burroughs and seconded by Bockoven to introduce and adopt Resolution #366, changing corporation status to political subdivision, attached to these minutes. Roll call vote: Burroughs yes, Bockoven yes, Cooper yes. Motion carried.

Executive Session – Personnel: A motion was made by Cooper and seconded by Bockoven to go into Executive Session. Roll call vote: Cooper yes, Bockoven yes, Burroughs yes. Motion carried and Council adjourned from regular session at 9:10 P.M.

A motion was made by Bockoven and seconded by Burroughs to return to Regular Session. Roll call vote: Bockoven yes, Burroughs yes, Cooper yes. Motion carried and Council returned to regular session at 9:30 P.M.

Hire Police Officer: A motion was made by Cooper and seconded by Burroughs to hire Chad A. Craghead at a starting wage of \$10.50. Roll call vote: Cooper yes, Burroughs yes, Bockoven yes. Motion carried.

ADJOURNMENT: A motion was made by Bockoven and seconded by Cooper to adjourn the meeting. Roll call vote: Bockoven yes, Cooper yes, Burroughs yes. Motion carried and meeting adjourned at 9:32 P.M.
