REPORTS OF OFFICERS, BOARDS AND COMMITTEES: Written reports received were Library Board minutes for March 20, 2003; Milford Aging Commission minutes for February 27, 2003; Planning & Zoning minutes for March 31, 2003; Police Dept. Activity Report for March 2003.

Neal — Recreation Board met and decided on field rates. Anderson submitted a report for book circulation in February and March. Library has 3 computers and 2 printers they need to get rid of. Siebken total calls for service for the month of March are 1001, with a year to date total of 2966. 911 Agency Board will be receiving approximately \$33,000.00 from Homeland Security to offset the cost of the new radio system.

COMMUNICATIONS: Sales tax received for the month of January 2003 was \$11,461.03.

PUBLIC HEARING - Citizens Advisory Committee: Mayor Plessel opened the Public Hearing at 7:40 pm. Dean Bruha reported no new activity but has been contacted by a firm to build housing units. Milford is one of 3 communities being considered for this project. President Roger Wittrock of the Chamber of Commerce approached Dean to use funds for promoting the community. The Chamber is currently working on the 2003 directory. No further comments the public hearing closed at 7:43 pm.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Planning & Zoning Procedures for Building Permits: Discussion was held as how to distribute the information. Mailing to everyone seemed costly. It was decided to place a Public information ad in the Milford Times along with posting the same ad at several locations in town. Discussion was held as to surveying, locating corner stakes and supplying a site map to the Planning and Zoning when construction is scheduled. As long as corner stakes can be located from a legal description, a new survey would not need to be done, but a site map will still need to be provided. Fortune suggested setting precedence by requesting 5/8" rebar used for corner stakes of any new development. A motion was made by Fortune and seconded by Bruha to approve the P & Z Procedures for Building Permits and to hand them out as permits are applied for. Roll call vote: Fortune yes, Bruha yes, Anderson yes, Neal yes. Motion carried. Reporter Tim Laux arrived.

Introduction and Adoption of Ordinance – Cemetery Board: Revisions of the cemetery board ordinance were discussed and the Council decided to table item to the special meeting for final approval.

Discuss 8.204 – Sidewalks; Repair: Discussion was held on the amount of time that should be given to make arrangements for repair and to complete the repair. It was noted that contractors are hard to get for small projects like sidewalk repair. Item tabled until the regular May meeting when Blevens will have an ordinance to review for final approval.

NEW BUSINESS:

Approve Fire Dept. Roster: A motion was made by Fortune and seconded by Neal to approve the Fire Dept. membership roster submitted. Roll call vote: Fortune yes, Neal yes, Anderson yes, Bruha yes. Motion carried. (Roster attached)

Hire Pool Employees & Set Wages: A motion was made by Neal and seconded by Bruha to approve the following individuals as Pool employees for the 2003 season: Manager, Jamie Opfer – salary \$4,088.07; Assistant Manager, Pat Whitney – salary \$3,160.00; Head Lifeguard, Amanda Fichtner - \$7.10 per hr; Lifeguards: Sheri Condreay - \$6.85 per hr., Joel Condreay - \$6.55 per hr., Dustin Lindgren - \$6.70 per hr., Beth Dierberger - \$6.40 per hr., Ashley Fosler - \$6.40 per hr., Kristin Larsen - \$6.40 per hr. and Whitney Troyer - \$6.40 per hr. Roll call vote: Neal yes, Bruha yes, Anderson yes, Fortune yes. Motion carried.

Private Wells: A motion was made by Fortune and seconded by Bruha to approve the renewal of private well applications made by Melodie Peterson 742 1st St., Miles McGonigle 303 N. "F" St., Beth Stutzman 465 North "F" St., Rick Bell 905 Park Ave. Roll call vote: Fortune yes, Bruha yes, Anderson yes, Neal yes. Motion carried.

Approve Payments – Olsson Assoc., Water Storage Tank: A motion was made by Fortune and seconded by Neal to approve payment of invoice #57976 in the amount of \$1,140.61, #57977 in the amount of \$3,094.12 and #57978 in the amount of \$1,908.69. Roll call vote: Fortune yes, Neal yes, Anderson yes, Bruha yes. Motion carried.

J.E.O. – **OCCT Implementation:** A motion was made by Fortune and seconded by Bruha to approve payment of invoice #29866 in the amount of \$2,140.00. Roll call vote: Fortune yes, Bruha yes, Anderson yes, Neal yes. Motion carried.

Rogge Engineering – Water System Implementation: A motion was made by Fortune and seconded by Bruha to approve payment of certificate #3 in the amount of \$16,561.62 for water system improvements.

Roll call vote: Fortune yes, Bruha yes, Anderson yes, Neal yes. Motion carried.

MSMSS Rogge Ent. – OCCT Implementation: A motion was made by Fortune and seconded by Neal to approve payment of application #1 in the amount of \$4,420.80. Roll call vote: Fortune yes, Neal yes, Anderson yes, Bruha yes. Motion carried.

Change May Council meeting date to May 7, 2003. Mayor and Council agreed to change meeting date.

Stop Sign – Park Ave. & "E" Street: Charlie Pierce presented a petition with signatures of individuals concerned about the speed of traffic and the need for stop signs at the corners of Park Ave. and "E" Streets. In the last 7 years the number of families with small children has increased. It was noted that many "walkers" use this area and the corner seems very dangerous. Chief Siebken noted the advantages of placing stop signs at Park Ave. for westbound traffic and "E" Street for southbound traffic. It was also noted that "Children at Play" signs should be posted on Park Ave. east of Clair Lane and on "E" Street north of Linden Ave. A motion was made by Bruha and seconded by Fortune to place stop signs and children at play signs at the locations noted above. Roll call vote: Bruha yes, Fortune yes, Anderson yes, Neal yes. Motion carried.

Set Special meeting date – Webermeier Scholarships: Mayor Plessel noted that a special meeting would be held on Friday, April 11, 2003 at 5:00 pm.

Williams Addition Plat Approval: Roger Kness informed the Council that the homeowner, Bryan Miller, would like to add 110' to his north property line. All requirements for the subdivision have been met. Planning & Zoning recommended the approval of the plat. A motion was made by Bruha and seconded by Neal to approve the Williams Addition Plat as presented. Roll call vote: Bruha yes, Neal yes, Anderson yes, Fortune yes. Motion carried.

Permanent/Semi-Permanent Encroachment in alley: Bruha submitted a list of 50 addresses from individuals that have items encroaching the alley. The items mentioned were junk, debris and some structural buildings. S.C.C. surveying dept. would be interested in shooting these alleys and marking their original placement. Fortune noted that alleys have a tendency to shift over the years. The month of May is very busy for the maintenance dept. but they may be able to clean up some of the alleys during June. Bruha wanted to inform the Council of this situation and what was being planned for implementation.

Off Street Parking Concerns: Bruha noted a problem with some single-family dwellings turned into multi-family dwellings and the lack of parking space available for multiple tenants. Bruha questioned whether the Council could enact policy where the property owner would have to provide adequate parking for the number of tenants residing at a house. The city has parking regulations for any new construction but is concerned about existing homes. Blevens will look into enforcement of this situation and the Council will readdress it at the May meeting.

ADJOURNMENT: A motion was made by Fortune and seconded by Neal to adjourn the meeting. Roll call vote: Fortune yes, Neal yes, Anderson yes, Bruha yes. Motion carried and meeting adjourned at 9:06 pm.
