# CITY OF MILFORD REGULAR MEETING AUGUST 7, 2007 MINUTES

A regular meeting of the Mayor and Council of the City of Milford, Nebraska was held at the Webermeier Library Community Room in said City on the 7<sup>th</sup> day of August 2007 at 7:30 pm. Present were: Mayor J. Elaine Plessel; Council members: Jeff Baker, Rick Fortune, Lyle Neal; Attorney Robert Blevens; Chief of Police Forrest Siebken, Maintenance Supt. **COMMUNICATIONS:** \*Sales tax received for the month of May 2007 was \$11,867.06. \*Resignation letter received from Erika Hartwig with her last day being August 3, 2007.

## **UNFINISHED BUSINESS:**

Feasibility Study for Assisted Living Facility, Economic Development: This item was tabled after some discussion last month. The Economic Development approved the concept of the feasibility study but the City had some reservations about footing the entire \$6,000. A partnership was created with the idea of the Economic Development paying 1/3 of the fee and private investors paying 2/3. The first step would allow the feasibility study to take place. A motion was made by Bruha to allow \$2,000.00 of the Economic Funds to be used for the feasibility study with the other \$4,000.00 provided by private investors. Gerry Dunlap clarified how the reimbursement of the \$6,000.00 would happen. If the feasibility study showed positive results for Milford to support an assisted living facility and investors agreed to support the project, then the \$6,000.00 would be reimbursed. Only if the project is completed will the study funds be reimbursed. If the project cannot move forward than all involved will loose the \$6,000.00. A projection of property taxes needed would be \$83,759.00. Judy Stohlman stated that there are currently facilities in Broken Bow, Studies show that approximately 45 people O'Neill and Gothenburg. occupying the facility will create a positive flow of income and success. The actual feasibility study will be handled thru a consulting firm out of Kansas City. The motion was then seconded by Neal. Roll call vote: Bruha yes, Neal yes, Baker yes, Fortune yes. Motion carried.

### **NEW BUSINESS:**

**Review and approve E911 Budget:** Item not ready for discussion.

Police in General – Jack Zimmerman: Jack not present.

**Introduction and Adoption of Ordinance – Vacate alley east of "B" Street between 6<sup>th</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> Streets:** Steve Carritt approached the Board of Adjustments with a variance request to add onto his current storage garage. The request was denied, but a suggestion was made to vacate the alley adding 10' to the Carritt property, which would allow him to meet his required setbacks. A motion was made by Bruha and seconded by Fortune to introduce the following ordinance:

ORDINANCE OF THE CITY MILFORD. AN OF NEBRASKA TO VACATE THE ALLEY LYING EAST OF B STREET AND BETWEEN SIXTH AND SEVENTH STREET IN THE CITY OF MILFORD, SEWARD COUNTY, NEBRASKA; TO RETAIN AN EASEMENT OVER AND ACROSS SAID ABANDONED ALLEY FOR LOCATION OF WATER, SEWER, ELECTRICAL, TELEPHONE, AND OTHER MUNICIPAL PURPOSES: TO PROVIDE THE MANNER FOR DETERMINATION OF DAMAGES BY CITIZENS OF THE CITY OR BY OWNERS OF PROPERTY THEREIN; REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES IN CONFLICT HEREWITH: AND PRESCRIBING THE TIME THIS ORDINANCE SHALL BE IN FORCE AND TAKE EFFECT. **Create sidewalk improvement district – west side of "D" Street and west** side of "F" Street north of Hwy 6: Bruha noted after the Hwy study it was recommended to move the yellow flashing lights to First Street in front of the Elementary School and place striping across the Hwy. Bruha consulted with the Council regarding creating a sidewalk improvement district along the west side of "F" Street and the west side of "D" Street just north of Hwy 6. "F" Street is 66' wide and the west side of the street in question has bushes and a fence which are probably in the public right-of-way. "D" Street is an unusual situation due to the right-of-way being different in width on the west side compared to the east side. Sean Kremer will need to be approached about placement of the sidewalk. There is also an open ditch which will require the culvert to be extended westward for sidewalk placement. Mayor Plessel questioned whether a sidewalk was present on the south side of Hwy 6 on "F" Street. Bruha answered yes. The additional sidewalk needed to complete a safe route to the schools is only  $\frac{1}{2}$  block at each location. Neal questioned Bruha as to what the City would gain by creating a sidewalk district. Bruha clarified after notifying the property owners and requesting they put in the sidewalks, if they do not respond, then the City can go in and do the work and assess the cost back to the property owner. The council asked Bruha if he had any idea of the cost involved. Bruha didn't have any Fortune suggested taking the path with the least estimates of cost. resistance. The Council discussed the lack of space available along the west side of "D" Street. It was suggested to approach Sean Kremer about giving up some of his property if the City would absorb the cost of the sidewalk. A survey would need to be done and a deed dedicating the property towards public street/right-of-way. Blevens questioned if there were design standards which would prevent sidewalks along the Hwy. Bruha will approach Sean Kremer regarding cost sharing and bring information back the next Council meeting.

**Approve Initial Order for Webermeier Scholarships:** A motion was made by Neal and seconded by Fortune to approve the initial order of 26 scholarships for the first semester of the 2007-2008 school year at \$538.50 a piece, totaling approx. \$14,000.00. Roll call vote: Neal yes, Fortune yes, Baker yes, Bruha yes. Motion carried.

**ADJOURNMENT:** A motion was made by Bruha and seconded by Baker to adjourn the meeting. Roll call vote: Bruha yes, Baker yes, Fortune yes, Neal yes. Motion carried and meeting adjourned at 8:23 pm.
