REPORTS OF OFFICERS, BOARDS AND COMMITTEES: Written reports received were Police Dept. Activity Report for December 2006; MVFD Fire and Rescue NARSIS reports for December 2006 and year end. *<u>Bruha</u> – NPPD notification of street light rate increase. *<u>Chief Siebken</u> reported 11,355 total calls for service in the year 2006. *<u>Wayne Stohlmann</u> – finalizing plans for the upcoming storm season. Need to replace the siren on "F" Street. Approximate cost \$30,000.00, will need to be budgeted next fiscal year. Ann Dovel arrived.

COMMUNICATIONS: *Sales tax received for the month of October 2006 was \$12,221.68.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS:

Interlocal Agreement for Utility Service between the City of Milford and the Milford Public School Dist.:

Blevens handed out a sample for the Council to review. It was decided to let Supt. Wingard review the proposed agreement and table the item until next month.

NEW BUSINESS:

Approve Committee List: A motion was made by Fortune and seconded by Baker to approve the Committee list for 2007 as presented. Roll call vote: Fortune yes, Baker yes, Bruha yes, Neal yes. Motion carried. (A copy attached to these minutes)

Set Public Hearing Date – One & Six Year Plan: Mayor Plessel announced that the Public Hearing for the One & Six Year Plan would be held at the next regular meeting of February 6, 2007.

Progress on drainage culvert – Kathy Eberly: Kathy reported that nothing has been touched since last months meeting. If the City would furnish the culvert and backhoe, Jim Eberly would be willing to do the work with only his time to be reimbursed. It will be 2 years in March and nothing has been

done yet. Bruha reported that the engineering contract has been signed and the City is waiting for plans and the bid process. Bruha also explained the work that will take place when all legal issues have been completed. Fortune noted that this is a small project and it will be completed by spring. Eberly expressed her concern of moving a shed prior to work beginning. The Council informed her to have the shed moved right away so when they show up to do the job there is no delay. Mayor Plessel asked Mark Frey to contact the engineer to receive a status report.

Silent Railroad Crossing - Walnut & Park Ave.: Bruha presented information regarding channelization of railroad crossings. This option would silence the horn and allow use of the intersection by Coop. Bruha wanted the Council's opinion as the application involves a lot of paperwork to the Federal Railroad. A question came up as to whether semi's can negotiate the turn with the intended new curbing and median. Fortune mentioned an article in the Lincoln paper where Kirkham Michael assisted the City of Lincoln in determining crossing safety. He suggested contacting Kirkham Michael to assist us in the same way. Engineers would have a better idea of whether channelization would be affective with our current street widths. A study should be done to determine the best route for silencing the crossing. Bruha measured and marked the areas for the median and the coop will run some trucks through to determine if they are capable of making the turns needed. Dean will contact Kirkham Michael and if possible present some information at the January 15, 2007 meeting.

Health Insurance - Linden Village Director, Glenda Maury: Hoggins explained to the Mayor and Council that Maury had called her regarding a request to be added to the city's health insurance plan with the idea of paying the premium herself. Her and her husband, Bob, will be losing there health insurance and after attending a Housing meeting she was informed that other communities assist the Housing Director with health insurance. Maury wanted Hoggins to check into this possibility. Hoggins checked with the City's health insurance agent and they did not have a problem with it. It is more of an internal decision. Mayor Plessel questioned whether the City would be opening up the policy to anyone wanting to pay their own premium. At this time there is no employee relationship between Maury and the City. The City offers health insurance as a benefit for full time employees only. The Council could not justify the request. A motion was made by Bruha and seconded by Fortune to decline the request for allowing the Linden Village Director to become part of the City of Milford's health insurance group plan. Roll call vote: Bruha yes, Fortune yes, Baker yes, Neal yes. Motion carried.

ADJOURNMENT: A motion was made by Bruha and seconded by Fortune to adjourn the meeting. Roll call vote: Bruha yes, Fortune yes, Baker yes, Neal yes. Motion carried and meeting adjourned at 8:17 pm.
