REPORTS OF OFFICERS, BOARDS AND COMMITTEES: Written reports received: Milford Housing Authority minutes for November 12, 2015; Milford Aging Services Commission minutes for November 24, 2015; Website overview for November 2015; Milford Police Dept. activity report for November 2015; Building Inspector report for November 2015; Library Report for November. Matzen – things are going good, slower time of the year. Kral reported 13 rescue calls and 1 fire call for November. TeSelle – continue advertising for maintenance position, first snow removal went well. Siebken advised Council of another potential individual coming on as a part time officer. Baker attended the Seward Area Vision Group meeting. Efforts are being shared with an organization out of Wayne Co.

COMMUNICATIONS: *Sales tax received for the month of September 2015 in the amount of \$16,133.25. *NPPD lease payment received in the amount of \$66,750.77. *Notification of Zito Media rate increase: expanded basic will increase by \$3.00/month and HBO will move to \$16.50/month if it is below that mark currently. Internet increases include \$2.00/month for equipment charge for standard non-wi-fi capable modem and \$1.00/month for High Speed Internet service.

NEW BUSINESS:

Election of Officers: A motion was made by Fortune and seconded by Baker to nominate Dan Kral as President of Council. Roll call vote: Fortune yes, Baker yes, Heckman yes, Kral abstain. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Baker and seconded by Heckman to nominate Ricky Gene Fortune as Acting President of Council. Roll call vote: Baker yes, Heckman yes, Fortune no, Kral yes. Motion carried.

Council Assignments: Mayor Bruha recommended the following Council Assignments: <u>Baker</u> – Parks, Recreation, Sr. Center; <u>Fortune</u> – Water, Sewer, Cemetery; <u>Heckman</u> – Pool, Library, Webermeier Scholarships,

Auditing Committee; <u>Kral</u> – Streets, Police, Fire, Auditing Committee. A motion was made by Baker and seconded by Kral to accept the Mayor's recommendation for Council Assignments. Roll call vote: Baker yes, Kral yes, Fortune yes, Heckman no. Motion carried.

Appointments:

Chief of Police – A motion was made by Kral and seconded by Heckman to approve the Mayor's recommendation to reappoint Forrest Siebken as Chief of Police. Roll call vote: Kral yes, Heckman yes, Baker yes, Fortune yes. Motion carried.

City Clerk/Treasurer: A motion was made by Kral and seconded by Heckman to approve the Mayor's recommendation to reappoint Jeanne M. Hoggins as City Clerk/Treasurer. Roll call vote: Kral yes, Heckman yes, Baker yes, Fortune yes. Motion carried.

Maintenance Supt.: A motion was made by Kral and seconded by Fortune to approve the Mayor's recommendation to reappoint Gary TeSelle as the Maintenance Supt. Roll call vote: Kral yes, Fortune yes, Baker yes, Heckman yes. Motion carried.

Street Supt.: A motion was made by Baker and seconded by Heckman to appoint Troy M. Johnston from JEO Consulting Group, Inc. as our 2016 Street Superintendent. Roll call vote: Baker yes, Heckman yes, Fortune yes, Kral yes. Motion carried.

Library Director: A motion was made by Heckman and seconded by Kral to approve the Mayor's recommendation to appoint George Matzen as the Library Director. Roll call vote: Heckman yes, Kral yes, Baker yes, Fortune yes. Motion carried.

Open sealed bids for property – Lots 7,8 and the west 20 feet of Lot 9, Block 3, Original Town of Milford, Seward County, NE: Mayor Bruha opened the 2 sealed bids received for the purchase of lots 7,8 and west 20 feet of Lot 9, Block 3, Original Town of Milford, NE. The first bid opened was from Farmers & Merchants Bank/Gerry A. Dunlap in the amount of \$37,250.00 with the intent of finding persons interested in a business building, develop a plan, and construct a building on the above mentioned real estate. The second bid opened was from the United Methodist Church of Milford, NE in the amount of \$33,500.00. They are proposing to use the property for a Fellowship Hall. The Church's current fellowship hall would then be given to the Little Leaps Christian Care Center to increase ther number of children services. A motion was made by Fortune to award the bid to the United Methodist Church in the amount of \$33,500.00. Motion died due to a lack of a second. Lengthy consideration of awarding the bid was had by the Council as well as consultation with the City Attorney. After much consideration a motion was made by Baker and seconded by Fortune to accept the bid of \$33,500.00 from the United Methodist Church to build a fellowship hall turning their current fellowship hall over to the Little Leaps of Faith Care Center. Roll call vote: Baker yes, Fortune yes, Heckman abstain, Kral abstain, Bruha yes. Motion carried.

Discuss/Action – Proposal for Scope of service from JEO: Dane Simonsen with JEO presented a contract for scope of services for: selecting potential well site, approving the well site through DHHS and conducting a test well program, in the amount of \$8,000.00. A motion was made by Fortune and seconded by Heckman to authorize the Mayor's signature and approve the scope of services contract. Roll call vote: Fortune yes, Heckman yes, Baker yes, Kral yes. Motion carried. Dane also provided the following information: An invoice from LBG in the amount of \$3,729.38; a preliminary opinion/estimate of probable cost for the new well; template letter for review by the Council for the invitation to bid a test hole/test well. Dane also had Fortune sign a needs survey letter to present to the State for potential projects which will allow us to be eligible for funding. In order to get on the list for funding we must have the needs survey submitted.

Approve Continuation Order for 2nd Semester – **Webermeier Scholarships:** A motion was made by Heckman and seconded by Fortune to approve 19 Webermeier scholarships @ \$526.32 per recipient totaling \$10,000.00 for the 2nd semester of the 2015-2016 school years. Roll call vote: Heckman yes, Fortune yes, Baker yes, Kral yes. Motion carried.

Hire Police Officer and set wage: Chief Siebken asked for permission to hire Louis Barker after satisfactory completion of his required testing. He will bring 5+ years of experience, DARE Instructor and K-9 experience. A motion was made by Heckman and seconded by Kral to approve the hiring of Louis Barker as police officer contingent on passing the required testing at a starting salary of \$16.75 per hour with a 1 year probation. No pay increase will be considered until fiscal year 2016-2017 salary discussion. Roll call vote: Heckman yes, Kral yes, Baker yes, Fortune yes. Motion carried.

Discuss/Action – **Performance Appraisals:** The council reviewed the format provided by Hoggins and Siebken for performance appraisals. A motion was made Kral and seconded by Baker to adopt and approve the format of the performance appraisals. Roll call vote: Kral yes Baker yes, Fortune yes, Heckman yes. Motion carried.

Discuss/Action – **Employee Appreciation Dinner:** A motion was made by Heckman and seconded by Fortune to authorize an employee appreciation gathering with an expense cap of \$25.00 per full time/permanent part time employee. Roll call vote: Heckman yes, Fortune yes, Baker yes, Kral yes. Motion carried.

Lagoon land use: Kral informed the Council that a pile of concrete has been deposited out at the lagoon due to the street/sidewalk repairs by the City. The RR has been storing equipment and other items on the north end. If we can add substantially to our concrete pile it would be beneficial, both financially and materially, for the City of have it all pulverized. We will need a large amount to make it worthwhile. Kral was hoping by mid-summer we would have enough to hire the service and have it pulverized.

Closed Session – Real Estate: Mayor Bruha stated the reason for closed session was regarding real estate. A motion was made by Heckman and seconded by Baker to adjourn from regular session into closed session. Roll call vote: Heckman yes, Baker yes, Fortune yes, Kral yes. Motion carried and Council entered into closed session at 9:04 pm.

A motion was made by Heckman and seconded by Kral to adjourn from closed session and return to regular session. Roll call vote: Heckman yes, Kral yes, Baker yes, Fortune yes. Motion carried and Council returned to regular session at 9:26 pm.

ADJOURNMENT: A motion was made by Heckman and seconded by Kral to adjourn the meeting. Roll call vote: Heckman yes, Kral yes, Baker yes, Fortune yes. Motion carried and meeting adjourned at 9:28 pm.
