CITY OF MILFORD REGULAR MEETING JANUARY 3, 2012 MINUTES

A regular meeting of the Mayor and Council of the City of Milford, Nebraska was held at the Webermeier Library Building in said City on the 3rd day of January 2012 at 7:30 pm. REPORTS OF OFFICERS, BOARDS AND COMMITTEES: Written reports received were Planning & Zoning minutes from December 19, 2011; Police Dept. activity report for December 2011 and MVFD Rescue NARSIS Report for December 2011. <u>Baker</u> – light poles in the uptown park will be installed this spring, they need to be painted. Baker asked for Nuisance

properties to be added to the February council meeting. Sirens have been installed and are in working order. Seward County may be interested in purchasing our old siren for placement at the interstate. Baker also visited with Viv Novotny with JEO regarding grant opportunities for a trail system thru-out the City Parks. Fortune mentioned that someone might want to look into a change in regulations regarding shortening up the median to make the rail road crossing at Walnut Street a Quiet Crossing. Lincoln has added a few new quiet crossings and the medians look smaller than what was originally proposed when the City looked into it. The truck traffic was discussed. Baker mentioned that the new Seward City Administrator is trying to form a Railroad Safety Division to evaluate the crossings in Seward County.

COMMUNICATIONS: *Sales tax received for the month of October 2011 in the amount of \$10,423.21. * Annual franchise fee received from Zito Media in the amount of \$6,052.13. *Invitation to the Seward County Bridges annual meeting to be held January 24, 2012. * NPPD representatives Craig Vincent and Bill Johnson met with Mayor Bruha regarding the Federal draft proposal to clean up the cole fire plants. The final proposal is so stringent that it will take billions of dollars to tighten things up.

PUBLIC HEARING – Conditional Use Permits: Mayor Bruha opened the Public Hearing at 7:42 pm. He turned the floor over to Mark Bright.

Storage Units at 664 Alimo Rd: Mark explained that he bought the old Harry Bachman property and has cleared off all the debris and trees. He has had the property surveyed and would like to construct storage units. He has designed them with a 50'setback which is what TA District requires. The Planning and Zoning favorably recommended this project.

Automotive Sales, Service and Repairs at 2342 Shepard Rd: Mark has been operating the "Milford Frame Clinic" for years and has fixed up pickups and sold them. He has applied and received his dealer's license to eliminate the additional inspection fees, making the process a bit more user friendly for auto sales. Planning and Zoning recommended this permit for approval also.

With no further discussion Mayor Bruha closed the Public Hearing at 7:46 pm.

NEW BUSINESS:

Action on Request for storage units @ 664 Alimo Rd: A motion was made by Kral and seconded by Heckman to approve the conditional use permit at 664 Alimo Rd to Mark & Sharon Bright for storage units. Roll call vote: Kral yes, Heckman yes, Baker yes, Fortune yes. Motion carried.

Action on Request for Frame Shop & Automotive Sales @ 2342 Shepard Rd: A motion was made by Heckman and seconded by Kral to

approve the conditional use permit at 2342 Shepard Rd in Grover to Mark & Sharon Bright for the operation of the Frame Shop and Automobile sales. Roll call vote: Heckman yes, Kral yes, Baker yes, Fortune yes. Motion carried.

Approve 2012 Committee List: Fortune questioned the need of a Cemetery Board as they haven't met for quite some time. The Municipal Code Book has guidelines for a Cemetery Board and they must oversee the bylaws. A motion was made by Fortune and seconded by Kral to accept the 2012 Committee list as presented. Roll call vote: Fortune yes, Kral yes, Baker yes, Heckman yes. Motion carried.

Set Public Hearing Date – One & Six Year Plan: Mayor Bruha set the Public Hearing date for the next regular meeting which will be February 7, 2012.

Introduction and Adoption of Resolution – Call Highway Allocation Bonds: Council member Baker introduced the following Resolution seconded by Heckman.
