**July Manager's Report** was distributed and discussed. (copy attached). 752 meals have been prepared and distributed since the week of March 23, 2020. Replacement of toilets and a "deep" clean have been completed.

Updated COVID-19 Facts & News--Kathy Ruzicka, Aging Partners, discussed tentative plans by the Seward and Utica Senior Centers and information from 4 Corners. Currently, Kathy is gathering information and guidelines for tia chi classes this fall.

Amy Salistean provided the COVID-19, 17 Week Report to update the board with information on new community involvement, education opportunities, and activities prompted by COVID-19.

Individual for Cleaning/Dish duties—Discussion tabled until next month. Amy Salistean and the board will each compile a list of duties to be considered

#### **Business**

- "COVID" Supplies have been purchased and received. On hand the Center has masks, gloves, hand sanitizer, cleaning supplies, foaming soap and dispensers and a thermal thermometer. Sanitizer dispensers and stand have been delivered.

- Warm meals made on Wednesday and Friday are going very well and have proven to attract more orders.
- Milford Plumbing installed three ADA compliant, high powered flushing stools in the upstairs bathrooms for a total of \$1935.00.
- Campbell Cleaning cleaned the upstairs and downstairs of the center as well as cleaned the carpet on the first floor for a total of \$725.04.
- The Milford Senior Center received \$4,000 from the Seward County Legacy Fund. It was noted by the review committee that "the director has gone above and beyond to personally make and deliver these meals as their source for meals was stopped when COVID-19 hit."
- 2020-2021 Senior Center Budget is in review and was presented to the Council June 26. More time is needed to get an estimate for the necessary construction project on the west side of the building. It will be presented to the Council as soon as possible to determine an amount added to the 2020-2021 budget.
- In the brief time that the Center was open in July 7/6-7/10), the Exercise Room was used three times and the Pilates Class was held once. There was significant interest in Tai Chi beginning again as well as the Video Exercise Class. Pilates and Tai Chi might be held in other buildings until the potential second attempt at a soft opening in September.
- The current \$8.00 a month Zito cable service is being cancelled by Zito as of 7/22/20 and a new cable service will need to be found. It would cost \$145 per month to continue with the basic cable package with Zito.
- A donation was given by a senior that lives in Beatrice for postage of her Newsletter. She appreciates being included.
- If a Meal Ticket is created while the Manager is unavailable, write the date and Check # associated with that check. This is important for tracking purposes if the need arises. Also, the "spent" Meal Tickets go into the labeled folder in the Manager's desk. They are not to be discarded.
- New programs are currently being planned and will be offered in August. They include but are not limited to Delivery Craft Projects and Milford Elementary Pen Pal Program.
- Condensation has begun to gather again between two of the windows on the north side of the Center.
