- The new refrigerator will be placed in the kitchen in the space by the present refrigerator. The new freezer will be placed in the garage.
- Leslie Patton will meet with the board on Friday, July 8th,as 1:00 p.m. She will have more information about the remodeling/redecorating.
- Water issues- there is still rain water leaking into the center on the southwest corner. Jeff Baker said these drainage problems are going to be addressed by the City Council. This could cost the city \$30,000 to fix the problem.
- Nancy was given permission to buy a new garage door and dehumidifier from the center's budgeted money.
